Behaviour was praised by instructors and progression noted in children's abilities and co-ordination across the Multisports sessions.</p> <p>Yr1: Ball skills (6 sessions), especially to promote co-ordination/gross motor skills.</p> <p>Yr 6 Swimming: It was identified by staff at St James that Yr6 would need extra sessions to give them the best chance of meeting requirement to swim at least 25m by the end of KS2 – this was taken up by DMc and Yr6 have received an extra half term's worth of swimming to boost lower attainers.</p>	£2,445	<p>Ensure each year group has at least 2 sets of in-school sessions per year as some year groups have only had 1 this year.</p> <p>Ensure all year groups from Yr1 upwards have at least 1 after school club.</p> <p>Closely monitor non-swimmers in Yrs 5 and 6 so they can have extra sessions if needed.</p>
